Arrange a hearing test with your local hearing care provider.

If you do not have hearing aids, visit your audiologist to do a free, 2-week hearing aid trial (offered by selected providers).

The importance of hearing aids and their impact on your cochlear implant journey

Whether you have never worn hearing aids or have tried them in the past without success, they are crucial in enabling us to assess your suitability for a cochlear implant.

Before we carry out your cochlear implant assessment, it's important that you wear hearing aids during waking hours for at least two weeks, and during the assessment itself.

This gives you time to acclimatise to hearing with an aid and helps keep the hearing nerves stimulated.

Adjustments to the aids are often needed during the first 1-2 weeks as your hearing adapts to the devices.



Trialling hearing aids

If you do not have hearing aids, you can request a trial through a local hearing care provider. This is only offered through some providers, so please check before proceeding.

Once you have confirmed your hearing aid trial, contact us and we will schedule your NextSense cochlear implant assessment appointment.
